DISTINGUISHED SUSTAINABILITY ONE PARK, ONE PLANET



“The supreme reality of our time...is the vulnerability of this planet.”
– President John F. Kennedy, 1963

The vulnerability of our planet is at a critical level now more than ever. The sustainability of our planet – our capacity to endure – is our “supreme reality” and well within our control. On an individual, local or global scale we have the ability to live and work sustainably by returning human use of natural resources to within sustainable limits; fostering sustainable environmental, economic and social development and supporting Green business practices.

At Century Park, we have embarked upon the strategic implementation of numerous Sustainability or Green initiatives, which will result in a significant reduction in the carbon footprint of the project through programs that will reduce power consumption, increase water conservation as well as enhance and expand recycling.

The following sustainability initiatives will have a tremendous beneficial impact on the environment. The initiatives/programs include, but are not limited to:

- **Lighting Retrofit Program** – will result in an annual savings of more than 1.5 million KWH and a CO2 savings of more than 1.8 million pounds.
- **Solar Window Film Program** – will achieve a 61% rejection of building heat load reducing electrical and HVAC consumption by 30% annually.
- **Park Help System** – implemented in the subterranean garage in early 2009 utilizing a green/red light identifying system to direct parkers to open parking aisles and spaces in the garage. The system efficiently directs parkers to these open aisles and spaces, improves traffic flow and reduces CO2 and NOx emissions in the garage.
- **Transportation Demand Management Program** – implemented to reduce vehicle traffic trips and coordinate rideshare, mass transit and bike-to-work programs.

- **Satellite Irrigation Monitoring System** – will reduce annual water consumption for irrigation by 40%.
- **Waterless Urinals** – will result in an annual savings of 8 – 12 million gallons of water.
- **Recycling Program** – has saved or recycled 735 tons of products and materials including paper, cardboard, e-waste, furniture and lamps/ballasts
- **Green Cleaning Products and Low VOC Mandate** – has resulted in the reduction or elimination of toxic chemicals.

A new 5800-ton **Central Plant** is under construction with state-of-the-art highest performing chillers, boilers and cooling towers for Century Plaza Towers.

Both 2000 Avenue of the Stars and Century Plaza Towers are Energy Star award winning buildings. 2000 Avenue of the Stars is currently in the process of applying for Silver LEED EB (Existing Building) Certification. Century Plaza Towers will be submitting for Silver LEED EB Certification upon completion of the building's central plant in 2010.

The Annenberg Foundation is pleased to announce the second exhibit in the Annenberg Space for Photography, an innovative cultural destination dedicated to both digital images and print photography by established and emerging artists.

The second exhibit features the work of winning photojournalists and visual editors from Pictures of the Year International (POYi), the oldest and most prestigious photojournalism competition in the world. The top images are chosen from more than 45,000 global entries. Traditionally they were shown on a smaller scale at the University of Missouri at the Missouri School of Journalism. Now, for the first time ever, after 65 years of success in the Midwest, Pictures of the Year International is moving to Los Angeles, where it will exhibit over 80 prints and thousands of digital selections in its new home at the Annenberg Space for Photography from July 11 to November 2, 2009.

About Pictures of the Year International

POYi is a program of the Donald W. Reynolds Journalism Institute, at the Missouri School of Journalism whose mission is to join citizens and journalists in programs that improve the practice and understanding of journalism. The goal of POYi is to provide educational outreach and professional development for students and professionals alike. This year POYi will collaborate with their new exhibition home, the Annenberg Space for Photography.

About the Annenberg Space for Photography

The Annenberg Space for Photography is an entirely new cultural destination dedicated to exhibiting compelling photography. The Space conveys a range of human experiences and serves as an expression of the philanthropic work of the Annenberg Foundation and its Trustees. The intimate environment features state-of-the-art, high-definition digital technology as well as traditional prints by some of the world's most renowned and emerging photographers. The exhibits change three times a year, however the common thread throughout is one of rich emotion. The Photography Space informs and inspires the public by connecting photographers, philanthropy and the human experience through powerful imagery and stories. It is the first solely photographic cultural destination in the Los Angeles area.
